**Democrats Abroad Announces Eight More Delegates  
to the Democratic National Convention**  
***Two Elected Delegates Will Represent the Americas Region***  
***One Elected Delegate Will Represent the Asia-Pacific Region***  
***Five At-Large and PLEO Delegates Also Elected at Global Convention***

Washington, DC – Today, Democrats Abroad announced the delegate election results of the organization's Asia-Pacific and Americas Regional Caucuses, which took place April 11 in Vancouver, BC. Additionally, the organization announced five at-large and PLEO delegates elected at the Global Convention, which also took place in Vancouver, April 12-13.

The eight newly elected delegates will travel to Denver, Colorado, to participate in the Democratic National Convention August 25-28, 2008. They will be joined there by six previously elected delegates from the organization's Europe-Middle East-Africa (EMEA) region. The EMEA delegates were elected March 15-16 in Brussels. Additionally, Democrats Abroad will send eight superdelegates. The total of 22 delegates from Democrats Abroad each have a half vote, bringing the organization's total votes to 11.

"At the Global Convention, we saw an incredible amount of energy, enthusiasm and a united effort to elect a Democrat to the White House. We have a great team of delegates set to represent us at the Democratic National Convention in August. I am very proud to say that we also met all of our affirmative action goals," said Christine Schon Marques, International Chair, Democrats Abroad.

"I'd like to congratulate and thank Howard Feldstein, Chair, Democrats Abroad Mexico, and Rhoda Green, Democrats Abroad Canada, for representing the Americas Region at the Democratic National Convention. Our delegates will give voice to those American Democrats living abroad in North and South America. We simply cannot afford a third Republican term in the White House," said Leo Perez Minaya, Regional Vice Chair for the Americas, and an American living abroad in the Dominican Republic.

"Delegates perform a critical function in the selection of the President. Living abroad, we are keenly aware of the implications of United States' policy. It is time to elect a Democrat to the White House, re-commit America to the values on which our nation was founded and to action at home and abroad addressing the challenges of a rapidly changing world," said Ms. Gary Suwannarat, Asia-Pacific Regional Vice-Chair, Democrats Abroad. Ms. Suwannarat is an American living in Thailand and voting in her home state of Colorado.

"I'm honored to have been elected as a Clinton delegate to the August DNC convention in Denver as I believe her to be the best qualified candidate at this time. I will, however, give my full support to whichever candidate, Clinton or Obama, is chosen to lead the Democratic Party into the Presidential election and the White House in 2008," said Rhoda Green of Democrats Abroad Canada.
- **Howard Feldstein**, an American living abroad in Mexico, pledged to Senator Obama
